SUBJECT: DCMA Policy-type Memorandum 26-001, “DCMA Implementation of Revolutionary Federal Acquisition Regulation Overhaul”

Purpose.

The purpose of this DCMA policy-type memorandum (PTM) is to implement the DoW class deviations to the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) and Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement (DFARS).

This PTM meets the definition of a policy-type memorandum pursuant to Paragraph 15.2. of DCMA Manual 4501-01, “Agency Issuance Program,” by amending the DCMA issuances identified in Enclosure 1 to implement the 37 FAR deviations effective February 1, 2026.

Background.

Pursuant to the President’s Executive Order, “Restoring Common Sense to Federal Procurement,” the Federal government is undertaking the first-ever comprehensive overhaul of the FAR, which will return the FAR to its statutory roots, rewrite it in plain language, and remove most non-statutory rules. In addition, non-regulatory buying guides will provide practical strategies grounded in common sense while remaining outside the FAR.

On September 30, 2025, the Office of Federal Procurement Policy finished publishing RFO model deviations for all parts (1-53) of the FAR. Departments and Federal agencies were tasked with reviewing and adopting the deviations. As of January 26, 2026, Defense Pricing, Contracting, and Acquisition Policy (DPCAP) announced that DoW has adopted 37 of the RFO deviations, effective February 1, 2026. DPCAP also issued deviations to the corresponding parts in the DFARS and DFARS Procedures, Guidance, and Information (PGI). DPCAP is currently working on adopting the model deviations for the remaining FAR and corresponding DFARS and DFARS PGI parts and will update the workforce accordingly when they become available.

Accordingly, as of February 1, 2026, all DCMA personnel **must use the FAR deviations at the RFO website (<https://www.acquisition.gov/far-overhaul/far-part-deviation-guide>) in lieu of the FAR**, for the following FAR Parts: 1, 3, 5, 6, 7, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 17, 18, 19, 23, 24,

26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 39, 40, 41, 43, 44, 46, 48, 49, 50, and 52. Also, as of February 1, 2026, DCMA personnel **must use the DFARS and DFARS PGI deviations on the DPCAP RFO website**

(https://www.acq.osd.mil/dpap/dars/dfars_far_overhaul_class_deviations.html) in lieu of the DFARS and DFARS PGI, for the following DFARS parts: 201, 203, 205, 206, 207, 210, 211, 212, 213, 214, 217, 218, 219, 223, 224, 226, 227, 228, 229, 230, 231, 232, 233, 234, 235, 236, 237, 239, 240, 241, 243, 244, 246, 248, 249, 250, and 252.

Applicability.

This PTM applies to all DCMA activities unless higher-level regulations, policy, guidance, or agreements take precedence.

Policy.

It is DCMA policy to fully embrace and implement the principles and directives of the RFO as the DoW transitions to the new Strategic Acquisition Guidance (SAG), which consists of a streamlined FAR and a series of buying guides that emphasize innovative and proven procurement techniques.

Key tenets of this policy include:

- **Adherence to the Streamlined FAR.**

All DCMA acquisition personnel will adhere to the revised FAR parts as they are released and implemented through class deviations issued by the Federal Acquisition Regulatory Council.

- **Utilization of Buying Guides.**

Acquisition professionals are encouraged to utilize the forthcoming buying guides to inform their acquisition strategies and adopt innovative practices throughout the acquisition lifecycle.

- **Continuous Learning.**

All acquisition personnel are expected to stay informed of the RFO progress and changes by regularly consulting the official RFO website on Acquisition.gov and completing any required training.

Responsibilities.

- **Director, DCMA.**

The DCMA Director must oversee the implementation of the RFO and ensure alignment with the directives.

- Capability Board Manager.

Capability board managers must ensure their respective capability board has fully implemented the RFO.

- Policy Owner.

Policy owners must:

- Update their issuances to align with the RFO.
- Coordinate with the Operational Learning Center Chief Learning Officer to train the workforce on the revised FAR and new buying guides.

- DCMA Supervisors.

DCMA supervisors must ensure that contract actions, modifications, and actions use the amended FAR/DFARS parts.

- DCMA Employees.

DCMA employees performing responsibilities in an RFO-impacted issuance will use the deviated FAR, DFARS, and DFARS PGI parts identified above in lieu of the FAR, DFARS, and DFARS PGI and attend any Operational Learning Center RFO trainings to learn how to identify RFO changes in DCMA issuances.

Procedures.

Policy owners will review their impacted issuances and draft a PTM to implement substantive or critical changes related to the DoW deviations. Policy owners will process their PTMs pursuant to Deviation #26-002, “Request Deviation to DCMA Manual 4501-01, ‘Agency Issuance Program.’”
